**MEAP invites applications for its seventh cohort of projects** to document, digitize, and make accessible collections at risk from environmental conditions, political uncertainty, inherently unsustainable media, inappropriate storage, or communal and social change.

MEAP has a two round application process. All applicants must submit a Preliminary Application through our online application system available at <u>meap.smapply.io</u>. All applications must be submitted in English.

# **PROJECT PLANNING**

- Review <u>MEAP Eligibility Requirements</u>
- Review <u>MEAP Guidelines</u>
- Start conversation with collection owners, archival partners, and host institution to ensure that all parties understand the project and all MEAP requirements

  - What is a Host Institution?

# DRAFTING APPLICATION

- Review Preliminary Application Template
- Focus on the collection to be documented/digitized
  - □ What is in the collection? What kind of material is in the collection? What is the content of the collection?
  - □ What is the current condition of the collection? Why is it endangered?
  - □ Why is this set of materials important? To whom is it most meaningful?
- Consider the project as a whole

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- □ What do you hope to achieve through an MEAP grant project?
- □ Consider which parts of these goals match MEAP eligibility and funding criteria.
- Draft a Preliminary Budget
  - Consider all salary costs (including benefits where applicable), equipment costs (hardware and software), travel, and other costs.
  - Exclude ineligible costs (See <u>MEAP Guidelines</u>)
  - Discuss overhead costs with host institutions. MEAP grants require accounting support, but cannot pay for indirect or overhead costs.

# DRAFT DETAILED APPLICATION

- Review MEAP Preliminary Feedback
- Attend MEAP Detailed Application Webinar:

- Review Detailed Application Template
- Secure all necessary forms: <u>Host Agreement form</u>; <u>Archival Partner forms</u>; <u>Copyright Permission</u> <u>Agreements</u> (provide UCLA Library with permission to publish and steward digital collections)

# Draft a Work Plan

- Consider the scale of a Planning Grant: will you document the collection at the box level, folder level, item level?
- □ For Project Grants, what will you digitize and how? What equipment will you need? How will you manage both digitization and metadata creation?
- □ Who will do the work of the project? Who will write documentation? Do you need to engage a broader community to capture knowledge about the collection?
- Add Detail
  - Recommended: Review <u>MEAP Metadata Handbook</u> to elaborate on how you will meet MEAP requirements
  - $\hfill\square$  Add detail about the amount of material to be digitized or inventoried
  - Consider community engagement: Who is represented in this collection and how will they be included in the documentation process?
